Spine surgery – cervical, thoracic, lumbar, sacral, and sacroiliac joint fusion

- · Bone grafts
- Bone growth stimulators
- Cervical/lumbar spinal fusions
- Cervical/lumbar spinal laminectomy
- · Cervical/lumbar spinal discectomy
- · Cervical/lumbar spinal disc arthroplasty (replacement)
- Sacroiliac joint fusion
- Spinal deformity (scoliosis/kyphosis)
- · Vertebroplasty/kyphoplasty

Level of care

Carelon level of care guidelines determine the appropriate level of care necessary to safely and effectively perform the intended musculoskeletal surgical procedure. Settings include:

- · Observation outpatient surgical
- · Acute inpatient surgical
- Outpatient surgical (excluding observation)
- · Ambulatory surgical center
- Office (only available for interventional pain management procedures)

How to participate

Registration
